

English

We will be reading Terry Deary Roman Tales:

In our writing we will be learning to:

Write a biography about a significant figure.
Write a letter about life in Roman times.
Write a Roman myth.

Maths

We will be developing our understanding of fractions.

We will continue to learn our multiplication tables.

Spelling/Phonics

We will have a weekly spelling list of words to learn. Spelling rules learnt will include prefixes, homophones and the “k” sound spelt ch.



Emperors and Empires

In the Emperors and Empires project, the children will learn about the growth and decline of the Roman Republic and the Roman Empire.

They will discover the absolute power of the Roman emperors and study the hierarchies of Roman society and the Roman army. They will study the first invasions of Britain in 55 and 54 BC and the Roman conquest of Britain in AD 43.

They will learn about Boudicca’s rebellion, Hadrian’s Wall and the Romanisation of Britain, including how Christianity came to Britain and investigate the legacy of Roman Britain in their local area.

Significant figures:

We will learn about a range of significant figures including Septimius Severus, Boudicca and Julius Caesar as well as The Ivory Bangle Lady.

History: In this history driven topic, we will learn about chronology, everyday life in ancient Rome, social hierarchy, the Roman army and the Roman invasion of Britain, significant people including Boudicca, Roman withdrawal and Roman legacy.

DT: In DT, we will design, make and evaluate our own bread-based products. We will consider what makes a healthy and varied diet and test different food products that are already on the market.

Music: In music this term, we will continue our learning of the recorder. We will learn how to play with a clear tone and begin to read staff notation. We will continue to learn staff notation, using the notes B, A, G and E. We will also compose a simple fanfare based on the topic ‘Emperors and Empires.’

PE: In P.E. this term, through the sport of tag rugby, we will develop our fundamental movement skills with a focus on catching. We will also learn to understand simple tactics such as attacking and defending in modified sports.

RE: In RE, we will learn to recall key events in the Easter story and understand why Jesus’ crucifixion symbolises hope for Christians.

French: In French this term, we will learn the names of different colours and opinions. We will also be exploring gender and learning how to pronounce une and un correctly.
