Dear Parents and Carers

This week we have been looking at a painting that shows how different life was like in the past. The painting is over 400 years old and was painted by a Dutch artist. This picture was painted by Jan Miense Molenaer in 1629. He has signed it with his initials and the date on the trunk in the bottom left-hand corner. It shows 3 children using different objects to make music.

The questions we asked the children are as follows:-

- Can you guess the name of this painting?
- What are the children doing?
- Do you think they are rich or poor and why?
- Why is one of the children not wearing shoes?
- How are the children feeling, whilst 'making music' in this picture?
- What might 'their music' sound like?
- One child is playing a rommelpot, Dutch for 'rumbling pot'. This was made from a jug containing water, with skin stretched tautly over the top. A small stick was pushed through a hole in the skin – when you moved the stick around inside the jug it created an ear-splitting sound.
- Can you make your own instrument at home with your families? Perhaps you might like to record at home, everyone making music together? We would love to hear what you create?
