



Snowdrop Fact File Snowdrops' latin name is Galanthus. Galanthus means 'Milk flower'. Snowdrops grow in groups of 10–15. They are the first to blossom in the new year—you can look for snowdrop flowers in January until March. Snowdrops grow in forests and grassland, near streams and roads. You should plant them in late Autumn or early Winter. Snowdrops are not the best sources of pollen. There are 20 different types of Snowdrop. Snowdrops have been known since 1753. Their bulbs are poisonous and can be deadly if you eat them.

They can be used as medicine for memory problems.
