Dear Parents and Carers,

Last Friday we were delighted to welcome our School Improvement Advisor (SIA), for a visit to The Mead. She spent time in observing teaching and learning at the Wingfield Site and then had discussions about school effectiveness and improvement with myself and Lyssy Bolton, Executive Headteacher. These are some of the wonderful words that she used in her report following the visit:

- The Senior Leader (Mrs Seviour) has an outstanding knowledge and understanding of the teachers, adults and all pupils in the school. Her knowledge and passion to do the best for the pupils is a strength at Wingfield.
- The observations evidenced outstanding teaching, learning and assessment. The engagement of the pupils was total, the relationships were warm and purposeful, the questioning open and insightful, the displays of writing were remarkable, the pace was fast but inclusive, the focus on Disadvantaged Learners was clear, progress was made by the pupils in all classes and the quality of learning and use of the outside environment for the Early Years pupils by the TA, was particularly effective. There was evidence of good use of language structures, peer evaluation, personalised learning, differentiation and exemplary behaviour. The school's ethos shows an outstanding climate of positive learning with a focus on respecting and enabling the pupils as individuals.
- The Mead's current judgment for teaching, learning and assessment is outstanding. The SIA verifies this judgment.
- The rigorous data analysis is effective in improving outcomes for pupils as teachers use the information for planning and leaders use the information for effective, focussed monitoring. The expertise and commitment of the head of school is a driving force to ensure staff have as much information as they need for planning and what she needs to ensure appropriate actions are taken to improve learning for pupils.

I am sure that you will be as delighted as I am with this wonderful recognition of our amazing school. The leadership team and I look forward to welcoming you to school over the coming week for conversations with teachers. Please do look out for your child's Annual Report which they should bring home from school today.

The painting we looked at was *The 9:45 Accommodation* which was painted by an American artist Edward Lamson Henry. The artist was inspired by rail road transport and his wife is quoted as finding the sum of "\$500, an almost unheard-of-price at that time" which her husband received for his work.



We asked the children to find the following:-

3 dogs, 1 pair of Oxen, 2 parasols, 1 brass bell, 1 soldier with a crutch, 1 newspaper, 1 pair of antlers and the time 9.45.

World Autism Awareness Week

(27th March – 2nd April 2017)



What is autism?

It can be hard to create awareness of autism as it is an **'invisible' disability** – you cannot necessarily tell someone has it from their appearance. Parents of children with autism often say that other people simply think their child is naughty.

Autism is more diverse than originally thought, with new ideas being put forward every day. One idea suggests women and **girls with autism have been underdiagnosed**, compared to men and boys.

Girls with autism may....

- Like **routine**, dislike change
- Be quiet, shy, awkward, compliant, **passive**
- Not ask for help, camouflaging emotions or **mask symptoms** at school
- Have explosive outbursts or **meltdowns**
- Be exhausted from the pressure of constant **social imitation/mirroring**
- Be a **perfectionist**
- Be very determined and **like to be in control**
- Have **sensory difficulties**
- Experience **anxiety** more intensely than others
- Shut down or cry over small things due to **sensory/emotional overload**
- Hate injustice
- Affect different personalities and may not have a strong **sense of identity**
- Be socially immature and **vulnerable**
- Try to impose scripted, **controlling play** on peers
