September 2022 – Monday Night is Club Night

Have you booked a club yet?

It is our aim to provide every child in KS2 with the opportunity to participate in a club after school. Clubs will be available from 19th September 2022 and finish the week ending 5th December 2022 with the exception of Young Voices, which will remain on a Thursday and After School Care which runs every school day.

Places are limited so this is on a first come, first serve basis. Please ensure you only make one choice as selecting additional clubs will result in no club being allocated. Club bookings will close on Wednesday 20th July 2022.

During this spell of hot weather and particularly in anticipation of the extreme heat forecast for the weekend and the early part of next week, there are key points for schools and to consider. The local authority advice is to consider the following mitigation measures ([our notes in blue](#)):

1. To reduce or avoid time spent in direct sunlight as far as practicable. [We will be using well ventilated classrooms and shaded outdoor areas – with limited time in open areas at cooler points in the morning.](#)
2. Make use of shaded areas and ensure children wear hats, drink plenty of water and if necessary, are wearing sunscreen. [In line with our usual summer weather risk assessment.](#)
3. Adaptations to school uniforms requirements. [Children can wear secure sandals and should wear light cotton uniform items such as the t-shirts/polo shirts, shorts and skirts and summer dresses.](#)
4. School and settings should make clear to parents exactly what your sun protection policy is. We would expect parents to apply before school or session and if necessary, send the child with an additional supply. Staff should oversee the self-application of sunscreen by children but should not generally apply it onto children themselves unless suitable safeguarding measures are in place. [This is in line with our policy for sun cream protection.](#)
5. Postpone non-essential activities that would otherwise mean excessive exposure
 - Sports days
 - Sports training or matches
 - After school clubs
 - Educational visits and off-site activities – please see additional advice on the LOTC Service page and EVOLVE to help risk assess this decision [We have undertaken rigorous risk assessments for hot weather yesterday, using EVOLVE, to ensure any events, including our Y6 residential next week, are safe.](#)
6. Ensure first aiders are aware of the signs and symptoms of sunburn, heat exhaustion and heatstroke, and know appropriate treatment. Check that the school has appropriate first aid materials and arrangements in place. e.g. cool packs. [Training has taken place.](#)
7. Follow advice from the other information sources: you can get health and safety advice from schoolhealthandsafety@wiltshire.gov.uk

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The Summer Reading Challenge

- Free to join either in person at Trowbridge Library or online at <https://summerreadingchallenge.org.uk/>
- For children aged 4- 11 years old
- Read six books (or more!) and earn a medal and certificate

Children often have a dip in their reading over the summer, however, the Summer Reading Challenge (produced by the Reading Agency and delivered by libraries) has been proven to stop this as well as changing children's attitudes in a positive way towards reading and libraries.

The challenge is for 4-11 year olds to read 6 library books over 8 weeks of the summer in return for various fun prizes, including a medal and certificate on completion.

This year the challenge runs from Saturday 16 July to Saturday 10 September - there will be a registration period in the first two weeks of the challenge, where children will receive a pack of resources; after this period (from 1 August) and once children have completed the challenge, they are invited to return to collect their final sticker, medal and certificate and to talk about their reading experience.

This year's theme, '**Gadgeteers**', is all about science and innovation. Developed in partnership with the Science Museum Group, the Challenge will inspire children to use their curiosity and creativity to discover the science behind the everyday and celebrates the role of the imagination in both reading and the sciences. Although there is a science theme, children can read any six library books of their choice; they don't have to be linked to science and they can read more than six books! They also don't have to be able to read, reading with a parent/carer also counts.


