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Reporting Covid-19 symptoms to the school

If you or anyone in your family is showing Covid symptoms, is being tested or has received a positive Covid-19 test please inform the school as soon as possible by emailing <u>covidreporting@themead.wilts.sch.uk</u> (including over the weekend and during school holidays).

Illness reporting to the school

Please be reminded that should your child have sickness or diarrhoea they must remain at home for 48 hours after their last bout to ensure the bug has properly cleared.

We also request that if your child has a temperature they must remain at home for at least the following 24 hours of their temperature returning to normal (without being medicated), again, to ensure that the bug has cleared.

Dear Mead Families

The Omicron Covid wave is starting to show a decline in transmissions according to national data, but we are very much in a situation, especially on the Hilperton site, where we have by far the largest number of cases experienced in the whole pandemic. Thankfully illness is relatively mild in almost all cases that we are aware of, but the impact on the school – as it is for all educationals settings – is highly significant. A few points of clarity:

- We have robust hygiene measures in place and good ventilation.
- Staff are testing three times a week or daily if a close contact.
- We are logging cases daily and in regular contact with local Public Health England officials.
- We 'bubble' a class if we get three or more confirmed positive cases which means that they do not mix with the rest of the school during that period.
- We send a local authority 'warn and inform' letter when a bubble is created, not before.
- We DO NOT inform parents of every positive case in their child's class, nor do we inform as to whether a staff absence is due to Covid. This would be impossible in terms of case-load for pupils, and insensitive in terms of privacy and confidentiality for staff members. We really appreciate your information to us as it helps us update the arrangements on a class by class basis and is of course a requirement for authorising absence.

Our main focus, alongside safe operating in the current situation, is to keep school focussed as much as possible on excellence in teaching and learning. Again, it has been a great week filled with wonderful lessons and children loving their time in school. To share progress with you, we have begun to write reports and are hoping to have <u>face-to-face Parents Conversations Evenings week beginning 28th March.</u>

Please be reminded that the school gates open at 8.40am and close again at 8.50am. It is our legal duty to ensure that all children are registered in class each morning and any absentees followed up to ensure that no one is missing without an explanation. The past few weeks, including before the Christmas break, have seen a noticeable rise in lateness and lots of arrivals between 8.50am and 9.00am, which has a significant impact on children's learning, from being late in the first instance through to the disruption of the class when a child arrives late.
