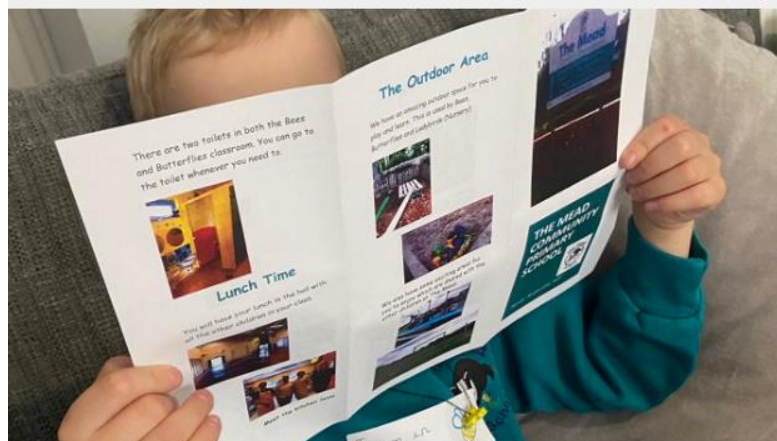
Dear Team Mead Families
